INTRODUCTION

A simple project that brings warmth and texture to your kitchen.

This linen kitchen towel is worked in a simple slip stitch pattern with a repeat of just 2 stitches and 4 rows, making it relaxing to knit while creating a beautifully textured fabric.

Whether you're making one for your own home or as a thoughtful handmade gift, this timeless towel is both practical and elegant. The natural qualities of linen make it durable, absorbent, and even more beautiful with every wash.

Thank you for choosing this pattern. I hope you enjoy knitting it and that your finished towel becomes a small but special part of your home - or someone else's.

SIZE

One size - width 11 ¾ in or 30 cm, length 17 ¼ in or 44 cm

YARN

Katia - Lino 100 (50 g - 150 m) - 100% linen

BC Garn - Lino (50 g - 150 m) - 100% linen

90 g = 70 g color 1 and 20 g color 2

GAUGE

30 sts x 48 r = 10x10 cm [4x4 in] in established pattern after washing and blocking

NEEDLES

US 2½ (3 mm) circular needles, **32 / 40 / 47 in (80 / 100 / 120 cm)**

You will also need: a tapestry needle to weave in the ends, scissors.

ABBREVIATIONS and VOCABULARY

k	knit
p	purl
st (s)	stitch(es)
RS	right side
WS	wrong side
wyib	with the yarn in back
wyif	with the yarn in front

Selvage stitches (the first and last stitch of each row): throughout the entire project, work the selvage stitches in pattern. This means that in right-side rows, the first and last stitches are knit stitches, and in wrong-side rows, they are purled.

Using **3 mm (US 2½) 80 / 100 / 120 cm (32 / 40 / 47 in)** circular needles and yarn color 1, cast on 99 sts.

If you use a different yarn with different gauge: the number of stitches for this established pattern should be multiple of 2 + 3 sts (1 st for symmetry of established pattern and 2 selvage sts, for example, 39 sts (36 sts + 3 sts).

Work the towel as follows:

Row 0 (WS) purl across, turn

Row 1 (RS) knit across, turn - [watch the video](#)

Row 2 (WS) purl across, turn - [watch the video](#)

Row 3 (RS) k1 (selvage st), ***k1, slip 1 st purlwise wyib***, - work * * until 2 sts remain before the end of the row, k1, k1 (selvage st), turn - [watch the video](#)

Row 4 (WS) p1 (selvage st), ***k1, slip 1 st purlwise wyif***, - work * * until 2 sts remain before the end of the row, k1, p1 (selvage st), turn - [watch the video](#)

1 - Using color 1 work **Rows 1-4** for 8 times, i.e. 32 rows total.

2 - Using color 2 work **Rows 1-4** for 3 times, i.e. 12 rows total.

3 - Using color 1 work **Rows 1-4** for 3 times, i.e. 12 rows total.

4 - Using color 2 work **Rows 1-4** for 1 time, i.e. 4 rows total.

5 - Using color 1 work **Rows 1-4** for 20 cm or 8 in.

6 - Using color 2 work **Rows 1-4** for 1 time, i.e. 4 rows total.

7 - Using color 1 work **Rows 1-4** for 3 times, i.e. 12 rows total.

8 - Using color 2 work **Rows 1-4** for 3 times, i.e. 12 rows total.

9 - Using color 1 work **Rows 1-4** for 8 times, i.e. 32 rows total.

Bind-off

Bind off 99 stitches: selvage st, k1, pass the first stitch over the second stitch and slip it off the needle - continue until all stitches are bound off - [watch the video](#).
